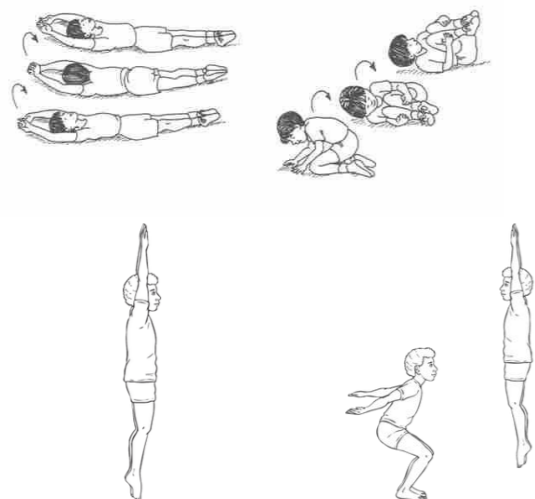
Afternoon Activities

Predict what conditions you think will be best for your plant to grow – think about light, nutrition, position – how will these affect growth?



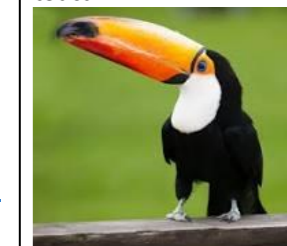
Art
