





	Recognition of exceptional and consistent attitude/actions/learning behaviours Recognition of outstanding commitment to rainbow values.	Children's attitude and behaviour clearly stands out as being above and beyond that of which is expected – e.g. showing consistent resilience and perseverance within a lesson when introduced to a new maths concept, not for getting 10/10 in a weekly test. Children are embracing an opportunity or situation and are actively showcasing a rainbow value – being brave and sharing an opinion or supporting a peer when they are in need.
	Respectful Abbots Green citizens	This is the expected Abbots Green Academy behaviour and attitude to learning - children are showing their rainbow values, behaving positively and respectively towards adults and each other.
	Reminder needed to reset behaviours	Low level disruption including calling out, swinging on chairs, lack of engagement & back chatting
	Recognition that there is a continuous lack of commitment to demonstrate positive behaviours.	Significant behaviours such as physically harming others or a continuation of the behaviours mentioned above (in orange).

Reading Champions


Every child completing their reading counts! Each week, the class with the highest percentage of children reading, win the reading cup and get a new book for their class!

Each term/half term, all the children who have done their weekly reading, completed their home learning by the deadline and show excellent learning behaviours in class and around school are recognised in our Always Club.







If the year group beat their arithmetic test cohort PB (personal best) by practising the areas they find more tricky, they are rewarded with an extra break.

Independence and responsibility

To help support your child in school, please ensure that they are:

- Bringing a named water bottle each day
- Remembering their planner every week on the correct day
- Handing their home learning in by the due date (or communicating with us before if there is an issue)
- Taking responsibility and looking after their named belongings
- Using breaks and lunchtimes to go to the toilet, rather than lesson time.
- Wearing their uniform with pride (including the correct PE kit)
- Remembering to charge their iPads ready for the next day

What can you do to help at home?

- Structure in time for home learning and for reading so that these are given sufficient time to be completed to a good standard.
- Encourage them to tell us of any issues when they arise.
- Encourage them to remove earrings at home on PE days.

In KS2, the children are provided with their own school iPad, which is used to support their learning. The children are expected to use this as a learning tool only.



Home learning







This is always set on Friday and due in the following Wednesday. Paper copies will be available for the few children who don't currently take their iPads home (iPad session 22.9.25 at 2pm and 5pm for those who missed it last year or who are new to the school)

- Weekly maths, English and a spelling task to be completed via Showbie/Ed Shed.
- A new spelling concept each fortnight and spelling games will be set on Spelling Shed which relate to the spelling concept being taught in class. This will support their weekly dictation completed in school.
- Times Tables Rockstars is highly recommended to enhance and secure the children's knowledge of multiplication and division facts. Please encourage your child to practice on TTRS as frequently as possible.
- Children who don't complete their home learning by Wednesday will need to attend a home learning completion club on Thursday lunchtimes.



Reading expectations



- Reading is a hugely important part of the curriculum. It underpins every subject taught and is a vital
 skill to embed in order to experience enjoyment and success across all subjects.
- The children have all got their new ZPDs from the Star Reading assessment and are welcome to choose from either the Ready Reader books, the bingo books in the classroom or can read books from home – or a combination.

How can you help?

- Ideally, we would like children to read daily and read for pleasure. However, we know that with
 commitments outside of school, this may be difficult to achieve. Therefore, the expectation is that
 the children read at least 3 times a week for at least 15/20 minutes. Book title, pages read/duration
 of reading should be recorded separately for each session and individually signed.
- Try to listen to your child read aloud every week this will help you to hear their fluency or if they are reading over punctuation. Discuss unfamiliar words to help broaden their vocabulary.



Assessments in year 5

We will complete regular arithmetic tests – this is to ensure that the fundamental number skills that have been taught are well embedded and committed to long term memory.

How can you help?

Your child will bring home their arithmetic paper to share with you. Please do spend some time going through it to celebrate achievements and to help them with any questions they find tricky. Where appropriate, please use the padlet to support with how these strategies are taught.

Assessments

In January, we will carry out our first round of assessments which will cover:

- reading
- maths (arithmetic and reasoning)
- GPS (grammar, punctuation and spelling)

Once all the tests are completed and marked, we will send home their papers and scores to be shared with you so you can see how they're doing and any next steps needed.


How can you help?

- Maths: encourage your child to use TTRS as much as possible to practise quick recall of times tables
- Reading: discuss unfamiliar words with them that come up in the books they read; ask them about the plot/characters and what impression they get of them. Encourage them to read aloud to hear their fluency. Read aloud to them so they can hear your fluency and expression.
- Spelling: encourage them to practise on Ed Shed as much as possible.


