April 2022

We hope you had a relaxing Easter Break and are looking forward to our final term! In geography we will be learning all about the continent of Africa and we will be completing a comparative study where we look at the similarities and differences between Nairobi and London. In history we are learning about King Edmund and the Great Fire of Bury St Edmunds. This term, in science Year 2 will become enthusiastic gardeners and will be given the opportunity to plant and grow their very own plants. We will also be learning about living things, their habitats and food chains. In art we will be focusing on textiles and collage, exploring how to manipulate fabric and create textual and visual effects. We will be making moving mechanisms in DT and learning about Christianity in RE. In computing we will create our own stop motion videos and in PSHE we will be discussing relationships and change.

English

We will be linking our English curriculum to our geography leanring. We will write African folk tales and own 'Tinga Tinga' tale. This term, the children will also get the chance to revisit descriptive writing but they will be focusing on how to describe an African setting using a range of literary devices we have been practising this year, such as expanded noun phrases, using commas in a list, and conjunctions.
