Parking Reminders

Please can we remind you all again to park respectfully and safely; it is really important that we set good examples to our children and follow rules/laws. Yellow zigzag lines on a road indicate areas where stopping, waiting, or parking is prohibited. These markings are commonly found near schools, hospitals, and police stations to ensure safety and prevent obstruction.
