This week our learning will be based around the story 'The Snail and the Whale' by Julia Donaldson.

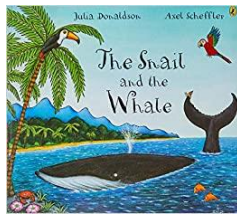
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Share the story

Read the story 'The Snail and the Whale' with your grownup. If you do not have the paper copy of the story, here is a link to the story on YouTube:

Tell your grownup what your favourite part of the story was. What things would you like to see if you travelled around the sea?



A fun day

At the end of the story, the snail tells his friends all about his adventure.

Can you tell your grown up about a day out you have enjoyed?

Use your words to talk about who you were with, what you did and what you saw.

Maybe you could even make a picture of that fun day.



Counting

Can you count to ten? Can you count to 20?

Stand up tall and count, marching your feet as you count.

Can you use your body in other ways to help you count? You could clap your hands as you count, nod your head, tap your tummy. Have some fun with counting!

Can you count backwards from 10, or even 20?!



Look at the sound 'f'

This week we are learning about the sound 'f'.

Can you think of any words beginning with the sound 'f'?

Play phonics hide and seek. Ask your grownup to hide some of the letters that we have learnt. Can you find them all? Tell your grownup which sounds you find.

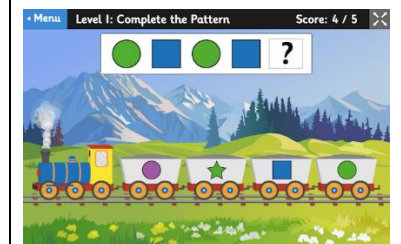
Shape patterns

Summer finders

We are now in the season of summer!

Can you make a 'summer finder' by cutting a shape into a piece of card (you can choose which shape!).

Then go outside, or on a walk, and look through your 'summer finder' and see if you can spot some signs of summer that are all around you!

Ask your grownup to write down the things that you find onto your 'summer finder'.



Draw a seaside picture

In the story, The Snail and the Whale visit lots of places, including the beach.

Maybe you've been to the beach before. What kind of things did you see? What kinds of things did you do there?

Can you make a seaside picture? You could draw it, paint it, or even stick things down to make it!



Underwater egg box

Use an egg box to create your own underwater sea adventure!

Paint your box and leave it to dry. Talk to your grown up about what you could add to your box.

You may even have some real shells or pebbles you could add to your box. Or you could draw some under the sea pictures to cut out and stick into your box.



Play dough

If you have play dough or plasticine at home, can you see if you can make models of the snail and the whale from the story.

Think about what colours you could make them, and don't forget to give the snail and big swirly shell!

Once you've made your snail and whale, can you retell some of the story for your grownup?
