	Read the story 'Jack and the Beanstalk' with your grown up. If you do not have the paper copy of the story, here is a link to the story on YouTube: https://www.youtube.com /watch?v=uvoJmMW-Wbo Talk to your grown up about your favourite part of the story. Have a look out of your window. What is the tallest plant you can see?	For phonics this week, the sound we are looking at is o. Listen to the Jolly Phonics song for o: <u>https://www.youtube.com/wat</u> <u>ch?v=a5npjY6shll</u> Can you pretend to switch a light switch 'on' and 'off' with your finger. Can you hear the 'o' sound in those words? Practice drawing an 'o', can you use your finger to draw it really big in the air, and really tiny on your hand? Ask your grown up write the sounds that we have learnt recently on pieces of paper (m, d, g, o), and hide them around	In the story 'Jack and the Beanstalk', the Giant is very big, and his feet are even bigger than Jack. Find out how long your foot is by using some small objects (like lego blocks). Line them up next to your foot, then count how many objects long your foot is. Maybe they are 5 lego blocks long, or maybe 2 crayons long. Can you find 3 things in your house that are longer than your feet, and three things in your house that are shorter than your feet?	Can you practise writing your name? Grown ups - please write your child's name for them to look at (Capital letter for the first letter, lowercase for the rest). See if you can write the letters in your name, or even just the first letter. How many different ways can you write the letters in your name? Maybe you can write it using chalk outside. Maybe you can paint it? Maybe you can use your finger to draw it in sand? Or even use magnetic letters to make it?	and give it some big leaves. See if you can write the numbers 1-5 on the leaves, ask a grown up to help you. If you have some chalk, draw this on the floor outside. Se if you can throw a beanbag (or something else) on one of the number leaves, and say out loud which number it has landed on. If you can't do it outside, draw it big on some paper inside, and see if you can rol a ball onto a leaf, and say ou loud which number it has landed on.

	In the story 'Jack and the beanstalk', Jack climbs to the top of the beanstalk and finds the Giant's castle! Imagine you plant some magic beans in your garden, you wake up in the morning and find a bean stalk that goes all the way up to the clouds. Use your words to tell your grown up, if you were to climb the beanstalk in your garden, what would you like to find at the top? Can you draw a picture of what you'd like to find at the top of your beanstalk?	This is a fun exercise game for you to play. When your grown up calls out a type of bean, can you do the action? Ask your family to join in! Runner bean - Run around. Jumping bean - jump up and down on the spot. Broad bean - Stand still with your arms and legs stretched out wide. Jelly bean - Wobble like you're made of jelly! Baked bean - lie on the ground. If your grown up shouts: Giants coming! - run and hide!	In the story 'Jack and the Beanstalk', Jack climbs to the top of the beanstalk and finds a huge castle that is the home of a giant! Using some junk from your house (like egg boxes, toilet roll tubes, cereal boxes or empty plastic bottles), can you build your own castle? Ask your grownup to get you some tape to stick it together! Maybe you could even use some paint or colouring pens to decorate your castle?	 When your grownup does the shopping, see if they can get hold of any bean seeds. Put some damp (but not too wet) cotton wool or kitchen roll in a clear cup or container, and place a couple of seeds in. Place your bean container on a nice bright window sill, so it can get some sun. Make sure the cotton wool or kitchen roll stays damp by watering it each day. Keep an eye on your seed and soon you should see it start to change! Talk to your grown up about what you think will happen to the seed. Why do you think we are planting them in a clear container? 	Ask your grownup to help you measure and cut a piece of paper long enough to fit around your head to make a crown. Now go outside, either in your garden or on a walk, and find some nice leaves (or draw them yourself). Now, Stick or staple your leaves on to your crown. Make sure you have enough to go all the way round. As you are now a king or gueen, use your words to tell your grownup what rules you would make!
