	Read the story 'Little Monkey' with your grownup. If you do not have the paper copy of the story, here is a link to the story on YouTube: https://www.youtube.co m/watch?v=o5_C- sE4X9A What was your favourite part of this story? Use your words to tell your grownup why you liked this part.	Can you practise writing your name? You can do this with paper and a pencil, or in other ways like chalk outside, or using your finger in sand or salt on a baking tray. Grownups- if your child is unsure of the letters in their name, write them clearly on a piece of paper for them to look at as they write their own. Please make sure they have a capital letter at the start and lower case letters for the other letters. If you can write your name, have a go at writing some CVC words like cat, mat, bat, tin, pit, pot, top, pop.	Little Monkey lives in a jungle. Which other animals live in the jungle? With your grownup, use the internet or books to look at some animals that live in the jungle. Have some fun and see if you can make the different actions and sounds that these animals make!	This week we are looking at the sound 'h'. Watch the Jolly Phonics video here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=aMnntsjDewQ Can you hop around the room like it says in the song? Put your hand up to your mouth and make the h-h-h-h sound to show that you're tired! Can you have a go at writing the letter h? If you can do that, try some CVC words starting with h, like hat, hop, hot or ham.	Sing the song 'Five Little Monkeys Jumping on the Bed'. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=4L6e0mwbGXw What happens each time? One monkey falls off the bed! Grownups - watch the song a second time and pause at different points. Ask your child to guess which number will be next in the song when one monkey falls off the bed. This will support the understanding the number concept of 'one less'.

Jungle picture

Go outside in your garden, or out on a walk.

Can you find some leaves and sticks? Collect some up and bring them back to your house.

Can you make a jungle picture out of the things you have collected by sticking them onto some paper. Maybe you'll make a big, tall tree that monkeys like to swing in? You could even add some animal pictures into your jungle picture!





Your friends

Little Monkey enjoys spending time with his friends.

Talk to your grown up about your friends, you may not have seen them whilst we have been at home, but can you remember fun times that you have had with your friends at Nursery? Or when you have spent time with friends on days out/at parties/at home.

Can you draw a picture of a fun time you have spent with your friends?



Making animals

Can you make your own animals using empty kitchen/toilet roll tubes?

Use some paper/card to cut out your animal face and stick to the tube.

You could make two different animals and they could be friends. Can you give your animals a name?

Can you use your animals to tell a story? Where could your animals go? Could they go on an adventure?



Leaf rubbing

Go outside into your garden or on a walk.

Can you find some pretty leaves of different shapes and sizes?

Put them under a piece of paper and use a crayon to rub over the top of them. You should see the shape of your leaves appear!

Maybe you could cut out your leaf rubbings.

Dough Dance

Using some play dough, plasticine, or something squashy, have a go at this jungle dough dance video:

It's a finger workout to help make your fingers nice and strong!
