This week our learning will be based around the story 'Tiddler' by Julia Donaldson.

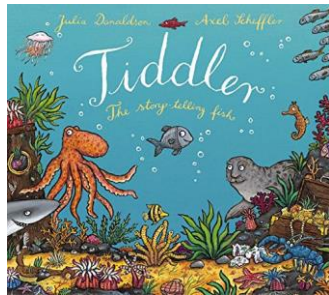

### Share the story

Read the story 'Tiddler' with your grownup. If you do not have the paper copy of the story, here is a link to the story on YouTube:

Tell your grownup what your favourite part of the story was. Who was your favourite sea creature?



### Under the sea picture

With your grownup, have a look at some pictures of the creatures that live under the sea. There are lots of different kinds!

Can you choose which ones you like best, and make an under the sea picture of your favourite under the sea creatures?

Which colours will you use to colour in your creatures.

Talk to your grownup about how these animals might move around under the water.



### Oceans

With your grownup, look at a map of the world.

Talk about the different oceans and seas around the world, and which creatures you think you might find.

Talk about the names of the oceans and their sizes.

You may have paddled in some of them when you've been on holiday or at the beach.



### Look at the sound 'b'

This week we are learning about the sound 'b'.

If you have a bat and ball at home, have a practice hitting or bouncing a ball and say the sound b-b-b-b.

With your grownup, look around your house for things beginning with the sound 'b'. Put some of them in a big bowl, and pretend to do some b-b-baking!

### Time

In the story 'Tiddler', we see some clocks showing different times of the day, when they are waiting for Tiddler to arrive.

With your grownup, have a look at a clock and talk about different times of the day and what that looks like on a clock.

Can you talk about the kind of things you might do at different times of day?

### Where would you go?

In the story 'Tiddler', Tiddler tells lots of stories of the adventures that he's been on.

Imagine you are a little fish swimming in the sea. Tell your grownup of the places that you would go, and the kind of things you would like to see.

Maybe you've met some interesting sea creatures? Or escaped from a squid, just like Tiddler?



### Make a sea creature

This weekend, The Morton Hall estate is organising an Animal Adventures Trail.

Choose an animal and make a picture to display in your window or outside your house for other people to find.

You could draw your animal, paint your animal, collage your animal.

As our topic this week is 'Tiddler', it would be great if you could make a sea creature picture to display. Just choose your favourite sea creature!



### Hidden treasure

Can you make treasure chest by folding over some paper?

What would you like to find if you opened up a treasure chest?

Draw a picture inside of what you would like to find, and tell your grownup what you've drawn!

Then decorate the front to look like a real treasure chest!



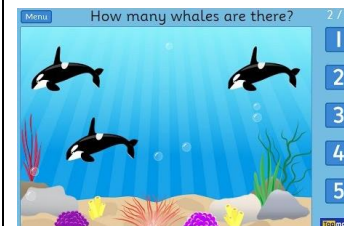
### Underwater counting
