- Conducting a science experiment that investigates: which aeroplane flies the furthest. Decide what your dependent and independent variables will be. Report your findings.

- Include key events that shaped his life: his wife's death, the founding of 'Lego'.

As Ole Christiansen, write a persuasive letter to a toy wholesaler to interest them in your wooden toys.

- Remember to introduce yourself and explain why you are writing.
- The letter should be formal as you do not personally know the recipient, so consider how you will address him/her.
- Be sure to use persuasive language: therefore, furthermore, I am certain.
- Include rhetorical questions: do you want to own the best hand-crafted toys in the world?

Why not try ...

- Building your very own LEGOLAND using Lego.
- Building a model, then create a set of instructions so that an adult at home will be able to create the same model.
