Write a short story based on the picture above.

Whose story could this be? Where is it set? Could it be a story from the point of view of the tiny dragon? Could it be from the point of view of a child that has found it?

What kind of story is it? What happens in this story? How will your story begin and end?

Where did you find it? Can it talk? Does it fly? Have you told anybody, or have you decided to keep it a secret? How did you feel when you found it? What are you going to do about it? Does it need your help?

Why not try ...

- Design your own fictional beast (it could be a dragon). What does it look like? What powers does it have? Is it good or bad? Label it and add colour.
- Create a home for your creature. Draw it or make a 3-D model out of objects from around your home.
- Make a cartoon strip about a day in the life of your creature. Is it saving the day or causing chaos?
