What happens next? Write the events in the form of a newspaper report.

- Include the 5w's: what, why, when, where, who
- Think of a short, catchy headline. "Chimps unite".

Write as diary entry as one of the chimps from the day when they were united.

- How did it feel to see your friend again? Have you missed them?
- Did the event in the past make you angry or sad?
- Are you excited for the future? What do you think it will look like?

Why not try ...
